PAYMENT:

A full deposit of \$500 per person is required at time of registration. Dav 1 - Thursday, August 4: Depart U.S.A.

Tour members make their own flight arrangements and depart for their adventure of a lifetime.

Day 2 – Friday, August 5: Tel Aviv, Jaffa, Herzliya

Upon arrival at the Ben Gurion Airport, our local Israeli representative will be waiting to assist in the baggage claims area. Then travelers will meet Dr. DeLancey either at the airport or the first night's hotel (your choice). Those meeting at the airport will be provided a short drive to our hotel in Herzliva for dinner and overnight beside the beautiful Mediterranean Sea. Upon gathering at our hotel in Netanya, an orientation meeting and devotional will take place on the beach.

Day 3 – Saturday, August 6: Caesarea, Megiddo, Beth Shean, Precipice of Nazareth, Tiberias

After an abundant breakfast buffet, we journey north along the coast to Caesarea, built 2000 years ago by King Herod. We walk through the ancient theater, the Crusader city and see the fantastic aqueduct that served as a back drop for the book of Acts. From here we drive to Megiddo. We climb this archaeological site where we consider many of the biblical connections around us (Mt. Gilboa, Hill of Moreh, Mt. Tabor). We then drive to one of Israel's largest sites, Beth Shean. We approach the site in a unique way, from the back gate, this will take us to the top of the Old Testament site (1 Sam. 31). We then visit the huge Roman site below, which includes a colonnaded street, bathhouse, and a massive theater. Finally, we will introduce the life of Jesus on top of the Precipice of Nazareth (Luke 4, John 1). We end the day by driving to our hotel near the shoreline of the Sea of Galilee. After dinner, we enjoy gathering together for a time of fellowship and worship.



Day 4 - Sunday, August 7: Gamla, Qatzrin, Mt. Hermon, Dan

We begin the day by driving into the Golan Heights. Stopping on the northeast corner of the Sea of Galilee, we are able to see the area of Bethsaida (the home of Peter, Andrew, and Philip, see John 1) and the location where the Feeding of the 5,000 took place (John 6). Our next site is Gamla, a Jewish city that was taken by the Romans during the Revolt in the 60's A.D. Here we hike down the trail to see a first century synagogue (one of seven that date to the first century), as well as the ruins of the city, called the "Masada of the north." Close by is the site of Qatzrin, a partially reconstructed Talmudic village. We see what a typical village looked like during the days of Jesus. Sitting

in a reconstructed stone house, we'll read from Mark 2 about the lame man being lowered down to Jesus through the roof. Next, we drive through a few Druze villages to the base of Mt. Hermon (Psalm 133). Here, we will take the ski lift to the top and relish in the great view. We then either hike down the nature trail (time permitting) or ride the ski lift back down. Returning to our bus, we drive past Caesarea Philippi (where Jesus asked His disciples, "Who do you say I am?" (Mt. 16) to the amazing nature preserve and archaeological site of Dan. This is also where the largest of the sources of the Jordan River begins. We walk through this guiet national park and hear the stories that took place here (Judges 18, 1 Kings 12). We end the day by driving back through the Huleh Valley to our hotel in Tiberias. After dinner, we enjoy a free night to explore Tiberias!

Day 5 - Monday, August 8: Arbel, Yardenit, Magdala, Capernaum, Sea of Galilee Boat Ride, Mt. of Beatitudes

We begin the day by visiting Arbel, a mountain on the northwest corner of the Sea of Galilee. We will have the option to hike to the top of this 800-foot cliff (the bus will take others to the top from the other side). The view from the top is the best there is of the whole Sea of Galilee below! Driving south to the southern end of the Sea of Galilee, we arrive at Yardenit. You will have the opportunity to reaffirm your baptism in the waters of the Jordan River. From here we drive to back to the NW corner of the lake to Magdala, the home of Mary Magdalene. Here we will see another 1st century synagogue. Jesus must have taught from here! Among the other ruins are ritual baths. After lunch (not included) we see Capernaum, the home center of ministry for Jesus here in Galilee. Here we read about the many stories related to the ministry of Jesus in the 4th-5th century synagogue. We also spend some reflection time on the shoreline. It was in this area where Jesus called His first disciples. Next, we drive to the Mt. of Beatitudes where we hear the words of Jesus as recorded in Matthew 5. Time permitting, we enjoy a reflective walk down to the shoreline. We end the day visiting Nof Ginnosar where a 2,000 year-old boat was discovered in 1986. From here we board our own boat for a time of worship and reflection out on the water. We return to our hotel for a late dinner and another free evening.



Day 6 - Tuesday, August 9: Jericho, Qumran, Ein Gedi, **Dead Sea**

We begin the day by driving south in the Jordan Valley all the way to Jericho. Here we climb the tel (ancient mound) to see portions of the fortification wall that supported the

mud-brick walls that "came tumblin' down"(Joshua 6). Next, we drive to Qumran and the settlement of the first century sect known as the Essenes, the authors of the Dead Sea Scrolls. You will have the opportunity to explore the cliff area where some of the first Dead Sea Scrolls were found in 1947. Our last stop of the day is Ein Gedi, where David hid from King Saul. As we continue, we enjoy a walk to some of the waterfalls in the canyon. Getting wet will be refreshing! From here we drive south to our hostel at Masada.

Day 7 - Wednesday, August 10: Early Morning Optional Hike - Masada, Dead Sea, Judean Desert, Mt. of Olives, **Quiet Reflection, Western Wall**

This morning we offer an optional early morning hike up a hike down into the Wadi Qelt. This exhilarating hike will the famous Snake Path of Masada. We begin the day by visiting the City of David and the new excavations of David's palace. Those who want will take an optional adventurous walk through the water of Hezekiah's Tunnel (1,720 feet long). Be sure to bring a flashlight and water shoes to walk through the tunnel. We then sit on the steps of the Siloam Pool and listen to the story of John 9. From here, we walk up through an exposed Herodian
