#### Day 12 - Tuesday, June 27: Arrive in Egypt

Today we leave for an exciting time in Egypt. Upon arrival at Taba border, we transfer to St. Catherine for check-in, dinner, and overnight at our hotel.

#### Day 13 - Wednesday, June 28: Mt. Moussa, St. Catherine's Monastery, Fly to Cairo

This morning we meet in the hotel lobby by 2:00 a.m. to start our day by climbing Moussa Mountain with our local guide (those who choose not to climb, can stay back at the hotel). On the southern end of the collection of peaks, is Mount Moussa (Mountain of Moses), biblically considered to be where Moses received the Ten Commandments from God. Climbing the mountain takes about 3 hours on foot following the Path of Moses – a stairway of nearly 4,000 steps - to arrive at the peak for the wonderful view of the sunrise. After enjoying the sunrise, we visit St. Catherine's Monastery, located at the foot of the mountain. The monastery is built around what is thought to be Moses' Burning Bush and is a spectacular natural setting for priceless works of art. We then transfer to Sharm El Sheikh airport for our short flight to Cairo. Upon arrival in Cairo, we transfer to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

#### Day 14 - Thursday, June 29: Cairo, Great Pyramids, Sphinx, Memphis

After breakfast, we venture to visit some of Egypt's oldest sites, and enjoy a camel ride. We first visit the Pyramids of Giza. The Great Pyramid of Cheops is the largest and is comprised of 2.3 million stone blocks. We enter this pyramid and visit the King's Chamber. Nearby, we visit the Solar Boat Museum, to see an ancient Egyptian cedar wood boat dating back 4,500 years. We also visit the Great Sphinx. Then, we visit the Necropolis of Sakkara, to see King Zoser's Step Pyramid. This vast site in the heart of the desert plateau is the largest necropolis in Egypt. We end in Memphis to see the limestone Colossus of Ramses II. Here the remnants of the nation's first capital and once the most cosmopolitan city in Egypt now lie scattered in the desert. Dinner and overnight are in Cairo.

### Day 15 - Friday, June 30: Cairo

After breakfast, we enjoy a special tour of the Museum of Antiquities. The museum houses the greatest collection of Pharaonic treasures in the world, including the expansive Tutankhamen collection of golden treasures. We continue to visit the Citadel. Inside, we see the lavishly decorated Alabaster Mosque of Mohammed Ali. We continue to the famous Suspended Church, dating back to the late fourth and early fifth centuries. We then visit the Church of St. Sergius, a fifth-century Coptic church built in the cave where the Holy Family stayed. We come to the Synagogue of Ben Ezra, where Moses was saved by Pharaoh's water girl. Finally today, we stroll through the Khan El Khalili Bazaar, a bustling warren of shops where you can bargain for rugs, copper and leather crafts, and much more. We return to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

### Day 16 - Saturday, July 1: Depart Cairo, Arrive in U.S.A.

This morning we transfer to Cairo Airport for our flight back to the U.S.A. and arrive home the same day.

This morning we depart Israel for Jordan via the Allenby Bridge, where we meet our agent and are assisted through security and customs. We board our motor coach to Madaba, the Moabite town of the Bible to see the Ancient Holy Land Map. Next, we travel to Machaerus (Mukawir). Perched on a 700-meter- high hill southwest of Madaba are the ruins of the fortress of Herod the Great. Machaerus is where John the Baptist was beheaded by Herod Antipas. We continue south to Petra, "the Red Rose City." Dinner and overnight are in Petra.

#### Day 13 - Wednesday, June 28: Petra, Amman

After breakfast, we visit Petra, a 2000-year-old Nabatean city. We'll walk about a half-mile through the narrow passageway with cliffs on either side (called the "Siq"). At the end of the Siq appears Petra's Treasury, a massive royal tomb carved out of the solid mountain rock. Time permitting, we will see Jabal Harun - the place where Aaron is buried. We then leave in the afternoon for Amman. Dinner and overnight are in Amman.

#### Day 14 - Thursday, June 29: Amman, Mt. Nebo, Allenby Bridge, Israel: Jaffa, Tel Aviv Airport

This morning we travel to Mt. Nebo to view the Holy Land from where Moses stood (Deuteronomy 34:1), a breathtaking view across the Jordan Valley and the Dead Sea to the Mt. of Olives and the roof tops of Jerusalem. We then return to the Allenby Bridge for our return to Israel. After our border formalities, we arrive back in Israel and continue with a visit to Jaffa. Then we have dinner and an evening transfer to Ben Gurion Airport for our return flight back to the U.S.A.

#### Day 15 - Friday, June 30: Arrive in U.S.A.

We arrive home in the U.S.A. At the close of an unforgettable tour, we take home wonderful memories of the Old and New Testament, a renewal of our faith, and a greater understanding of the life of our Lord.

This is the city where Paul was received by Jason (Acts 17). Paul was preaching the Word of God here until he was rushed out of the city. We transfer to our hotel for check-in and dinner.

#### Day 13 - Wednesday, June 28: Thessaloniki, Philippi, Kavala

In the morning, we start with the landmarks of the city: the White Tower, the Walls of the Byzantine Acropolis, the Roman Arch of Galerius and the Rotonda. We visit two of the city's oldest and most admired Christian churches, the Basilicas of St. Demetrius and St. Sophia. Then we visit the Roman Market (Acts 17:5). We then follow the route of the Via Egnatia and visit, like Paul and his companions, the area of Amphipolis (Acts 17), to see the famous funerary Lion of Amphipolis. Then we travel on to Philippi (Acts 16). There, we visit the Baptistery of Lydia near the river, where Paul baptized her. Lydia was the first convert of Paul on European soil, followed by the jailer. Also, we visit the ruins of the Forum of Philippi, the Christian Basilicas, the "Prison of Paul" and the Theater. Then we drive to Kavala (Neapolis – Acts 16), Paul's first step in bringing the Gospel to present day Europe. A picturesque port, we view the Byzantine Castle and the Roman Aqueduct. We return to Thessaloniki for dinner and overnight.

#### Day 14 - Thursday, June 29: Meteora, Athens

This morning we see the world-famous Byzantine monasteries that are perched on summits of gray rock peaks of varied and beautiful shapes. Their history goes back to the 14th century when the monks sought refuge in the cliff-side caves, then fled higher to build the original wooden shelters, which were later transformed into monasteries. Afterwards, we continue to Athens where we will have dinner and overnight.

#### Day 15 - Friday, June 30: Corinth, Athens including Mars Hill, Acropolis

After breakfast we begin our sightseeing with a visit to Ancient Corinth. This is the once-glorious city near the Isthmus, where Paul met Aquilla and Priscilla and spent a year and a half preaching the Word of God. We visit the Archaeological Museum, the Forum, the Temples, and the famous Bema, where Paul stood before Gallio, accused by the Jews of Corinth. Then we drive to Cenchreae, the little harbor from which Paul sailed back to Asia, thus ending his second missionary journey. Traveling along the beautiful Saronic Gulf coastline, we arrive in Athens. Here we admire the architectural wonders of ancient Athens, as we follow our guide to the world-renowned Acropolis, to see the Propylea, the Erechtheum and the Parthenon. We visit Mars Hill, where Paul delivered his message on the "Unknown God." Then we see the Agora, the ancient center of the economic and public life of the city, where Paul preached to the skeptical Athenians. During the bus tour, we also see Constitution Square with the House of Parliament and the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, the Temple of Zeus, the Old Olympic Stadium, and the Neoclassical Buildings of Athens. Dinner and overnight are in Athens.

#### Day 16 - Saturday, July 1: Athens, U.S.A.

We transfer in the morning to Athens Airport for our return flight back to the U.S.A. We arrive home the same day.

#### Day 12: Tuesday, June 27: Tel Aviv, Istanbul, Old City Istanbul includes Spice Market and Bosphorus Cruise

After breakfast we transfer to Ben Gurion Airport for our short flight to Istanbul. Upon arrival we go through customs and security and then secure our luggage where we will meet our guide and driver. From here we will board our motorcoach and begin our drive to downtown Istanbul with a Old City Panoramic Tour and then stop at the Spice Market, which derives from the herbs and spices imported from or throughout Egypt. It is still the best place to buy Turkish delight, dried fruit, exotic spices, and herbs. and then conclude our day on a relaxing cruise on the Bosphorus, which will take you on an epic journey between Europe and Asia on Istanbul's beautiful Bosphorus Straight. Along your ride you will see wonders of both East and West sailing through this lovely waterway separating Europe and Asia. Afterwards we make our way to our hotel for dinner and overnight at hotel.

#### Day 13: Wednesday, June 28: Hippodrome / The Blue Mosque/ the St. Sophia / the Serefiye Underground cisterns

After breakfast we begin our sightseeing with a visit to the Hippodrome: including several historic highlights such as the Church of St. Saviour in Chora. After St. Sophia, St. Saviour Chora is the most important Byzantine Church in the city. It was built in the 11th century A.D. The walls are decorated with breathtaking 14th century A.D. frescoes and mosaics. The mosaics relate to the life story of Virgin Mary and the life of Christ. Afterwards we have a short drive to the Serefiye Under ground Cisterns. We return to our hotel in time for dinner and overnight.

#### Day 14: Thursday, June 29: The Topkapı Palace with Harem and the Avrchaeological Museum, Grand Bazaar

After breakfast we begin our sightseeing with a visit to the magnificent Topkapi Palace, the residence of the sultans for almost three centuries. It is located on the promontory jutting out between the Bosphorus and the Golden Horn. The construction of the Topkapi Palace was completed between 1465 and 1478. Being the imperial residence of the sultan, his court, and harem, the palace was also the seat of government for the Ottoman Empire. In the Treasury section, we will see breathtaking displays, including the 7th largest diamond in the world, the "Spoonmaker's Diamond". The Harem is a vast labyrinth of rooms and corridors, once occupied by the black eunuchs, concubines, the Sultan's mother, and the Sultan himself. Time permitting, we will continue to explore ninety-two streets of the famous Grand Bazaar. The Grand Bazaar is the largest and oldest covered Bazaar in Turkey with more than 4,000 shops. A variety of Turkish Handicrafts, Oriental carpets, rare jewels, and inexpensive souvenirs - all sold in small shops next to each other. Remainder of the day is at leisure to explore Istanbul on your own. Dinner and overnight are at our hotel.

#### Day 15: Friday, June 30: Transfer to Istanbul Airport for return flight back home

This morning we transfer to Istanbul Airport for our return flight back home.
